Vending machines with healthy snacks & drinks




Feedback walls for improvement suggestions

Sleep pods

- Only sound within the pod is the alarm that wakes them up from the nap

- Night lights for those afraid of the dark

➤ Art on walls


- Curtains and decorative pillows

Classroom Architecture

- Class rooms have 3 main sections
- A quiet non stimulus room
- A social & stimulus room
- & the main classroom where lessons are taught
- Social rooms are colourful & Arty with music
- Quiet rooms are simple & plain colours, designs plus layout for students with special needs & ordinary students
- Sliding doors to maximize space
- Smaller section rooms are on opposite sides of each other to reduce noise impact

The addition of theoretical subjects would be a substitute for art based optional subjects.




This would be good for students who know what kind of career path they want to take.

- Green house







